# American Constitution Society of Campbell University Law School Constitution

### Article I

This organization shall be known as "The American Constitution Society of Campbell University Law School."

### Article II

### Statement of Purpose

The American Constitution Society for Law and Policy is a group of students concerned about the pervasive conservative orthodoxy in American law and politics. We believe deeply in the importance of law as the mechanism which governs the relationships between and among the individuals and institutions that form our society, and we recognize the direct relationship between legal theory and the broader political debate about the kind of society in which we live.

In recent years, the view has been ascendant that the traditional values of compassion and respect for human dignity have little or no place in legal discourse. This view permeates all aspects of legal debate: academic scholarship, judicial interpretation, and debate about laws proposed for enactment. The cornerstone of this legal view is an approach to understanding the United States Constitution that is essentially devoid of concern for the way in which the law affects the lives of the people who make up the nation in which we live.

We believe, contrary to this conservative orthodoxy, that the law, and, in particular, the Constitution, serves human values. We believe that the Constitution is a charter of liberty, the blueprint for a noble and unique experiment designed to prevent the excesses of government in order to protect the human dignity necessary for individuals to realize the full potential of their lives. The goal of the Constitution, and the United States it created, is to permit people to succeed in the "pursuit of happiness," one of the inalienable rights this nation explicitly was founded to secure to the American people.

We believe that the Constitution, and by extension, many other areas of American law, can be understood only by reference to principles of decency, reason, humanity and compassion. We believe that those who enforce the law must have concern for the way in which it affects the lives of the people who make up the nation in which we live. And we believe these principles should form a starting point for enactment, as well as interpretation, of the law.

The mission of the American Constitution Society is to harness these values of compassion and respect for each individual, and to re-incorporate them into American law and politics, in order to build a stronger and more decent national community. We seek to restore the fundamental principles of respect for human dignity, protection of individual rights and liberties,

genuine equality, and access to justice to their rightful -- and traditionally central -- place in American law. We want to strengthen the intellectual underpinnings of -- and the public case for -- a vision of the law in which these values are paramount. Our goal is a rekindling of the hope that by reason and decency, we can create an America that is better for us all.

### Article III

Membership shall be open to all Campbell University Law School students, faculty and staff.

### Article IV

The American Constitution Society officers shall be members of the American Constitution Society Executive Board, which will meet periodically to determine the general direction of the American Constitution Society and to decide issues of long-term importance to the American Constitution Society.

Only current Campbell University Law School students, faculty, and staff may serve as officers.

### The American Constitution Society officers shall be as follows:

<u>Faculty Advisor:</u> The Faculty Advisor shall serve as a resource for ACS members, facilitate the acquisition of speakers, and serve as a liaison between the local chapter and the advisors of American Constitution Society chapters at other schools.

<u>President:</u> The President shall call ACS meetings, coordinate the operations and direction of the ACS, and serve as a liaison between the ACS and the Campbell University Law School administration.

<u>Vice-President:</u> The Vice-President shall call ACS meetings in the President's absence and coordinate the activities of the Chairs.

<u>Secretary</u>: The Secretary shall compile and maintain the minutes of meetings and the records of the organization, keep a current list of members, update the ACS national calendar with chapter events, and be responsible for notifying members of meetings. The Secretary will also maintain good records to allow the chapter to pass on the contacts and expertise accumulated so that each year's chapter does not have to start from scratch. The Secretary will track participant and member information. This will be especially helpful for the chapter to reach back to prior chapter leaders. The Secretary will coordinate with the President, President-elect, and Secretary-elect so that records, notes, and files will be appropriately transitioned.

<u>Treasurer:</u> The Treasurer shall maintain the financial accounts and records of the ACS, set forth the ACS's budget, and submit the ACS's financial reports to the Student Bar Association according to SBA guidelines.

<u>Programming Chair:</u> The Programming Chair shall lead the Program Committee, which shall plan and organize the fall and spring events. The Programming Chair shall oversee the effectuation of programmed activities such as substantive panels and debates, networking events, career panels, and chapter bonding events.

<u>Communications Liaison:</u> The Communications Liaison shall be responsible for serving as the primary contact and connection to the ACS local lawyer chapter, and as the primary connection with other ACS student chapters in our geographical vicinity. The Communications Liaison shall externally coordinate with other chapters to cosponsor and organize events established by the Program Committee. The Communications Liaison shall be responsible for the outward advertisement of ACS events, the membership drive, and general membership meetings through the use of social media.

<u>Membership Development Chair</u>: The Membership Development Chair shall be responsible for organizing a membership drive in the fall and shall organize additional membership drives as needed to recruit new members and to assign them to committees. The Membership Development Chair shall also work with alumni, the Campbell's career services department, and others to help advance the careers of current ACS student members.

# Article V

The American Constitution Society officers shall be appointed by a majority vote of the current ACS members in April of each year. The first officers of Campbell Law ACS for the 2022-2023 school year shall be elected in the Fall Semester of 2022.

Each officer will serve for a term of one year.

In order to be eligible for an ACS officer position, a candidate must be a current member and have the endorsement of one current executive board member. There is no limit to the number of candidates that a current executive board member may endorse. If a candidate does not have the endorsement of one current executive member, then that candidate may still run if the candidate has the endorsement of 25% of the general membership.

# Article VI

Officers may be removed for good cause by the unanimous vote of the remaining members of the Executive Board.

# Article VII

Amendments to this constitution and to the by-laws shall be adopted by two-thirds vote of the general voting membership, except that no amendment shall be adopted without the affirmative vote of both the President and the Faculty Advisor.

# Article VIII

This organization shall be governed by this Constitution, its bylaws, and the rules and regulations of Campbell University Law School.
