Pharmacy Internship Program

General Overview

The pharmacy internship program at Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist (AHWFB) is a 3-year progressive longitudinal program. Each year encompasses new challenges that build on prior activities and give the intern a comprehensive understanding of pharmacy services throughout our enterprise. Our graduates will be prepared to serve as leaders in the profession and deliver patient centered care across the spectrum of pharmacy services.

Intern Year 1 (starts summer prior to Pharmacy Year (PY) 1)

Develops the student's knowledge and skills through experiences in acute care pharmacy operations. Interns will be active members of the distributive service line and gain experience with pharmacy automation, delivery, and compounding.

Intern Year 2 (starts summer prior to PY2)

Builds on the previous activities through experiences with the Pharmacy Assurance Care Transitions (PACT) team. Interns will have direct patient contact to obtain patient medication lists and conduct medication reconciliations.

Intern Year 3 (starts summer prior to PY3)

Develops the student's leadership, knowledge, and skills through experiences with enhanced clinical responsibilities. Examples include medication dose adjustments and conversions, therapeutic drug monitoring, and discharge education. Additionally, PY3 interns will serve as mentors for the PY1 and PY2 interns.
