#### **MEMORANDUM**

RE: Summer Course Information & Guidance - 2023

#### I. STUDENTS ELIGIBLE TO ENROLL IN SUMMER COURSES

Most, if not all, courses offered in the summer session are upper level required and elective courses. Since the first two years of FLEX study are intended to provide students with the proper foundation for upper-level courses, students enrolled in the FLEX program are not eligible to enroll in the summer session between their first and second years of study, with the exception of taking Criminal Law, Constitutional Law I, or Advanced Legal Writing (if offered). Upon completion of the first two years of study, students enrolled in the FLEX program may attend summer sessions. Only those students who have successfully completed at least twenty-seven (27) credit hours at the conclusion of the Spring semester may register for upper-level elective or required courses.

#### II. SUMMER SCHOOL TUITION & FEES

- \$1,340 per credit hour\*
- \$80 law general activity fee\*

#### III. MAXIMUM SUMMER COURSE LOAD

The maximum number of total credit hours a student may take in the summer is <u>eight</u>. This includes externship credits for which no tuition charges are paid (see "Special Note on Externships" below) and credits earned at other institutions. No waivers or exceptions permitted.

#### IV. ONLINE & HYBRID COURSES

For the summer of 2023, a only few courses will be taught as distance courses. Please refer to the course details for class-specific information. All other classes are in seat only without an option to attend remotely. Students who attend classes in-seat will be required to adhere to all Campbell Law health and safety protocols. Classes taught in-seat only may <u>not</u> be attended remotely unless a student is prohibited from entering the law school building based on Campbell Law health and safety protocols directly related to illness or quarantine from Covid-19 only.

#### V. BARBRI LEGAL ED ONLINE COURSES

Campbell Law is offering online courses during the summer session through a partnership with BarBri Legal Ed. These courses are taught asynchronously by professors affiliated with other ABA-accredited law schools.

Credits earned through BarBri Legal Ed courses <u>do</u> count towards the six-hour cap on credits earned through distance education.

#### VI. DISTANCE EDUCATION COURSES

All eligible distance education credits not taught by Campbell Law faculty (whether delivered by BarBri Legal Ed or otherwise) will be posted to the student's law school transcript as transfer credit, or a grade of "TR." As a descriptive grade, it will have no impact on the student's semester or cumulative grade point average. Depending on how the distance education course is graded, a student must earn at least a 75, or at least a straight "C", or at least an "S" (for "Satisfactory") for the transfer credits to be posted to the student's law school transcript. A distance education course taught by a Campbell law professor is not subject to the grading rules of this paragraph. Students who have successfully completed at least 27 credit hours at the conclusion of the Spring 2023 semester may register for any distance education course. The law school's complete Distance Education Policy can be found in the Academic Standards and Regulations document on Podio within the KivNet – Academic Affairs.

#### VII. DESCRIPTIVE GRADING & DISTANCE COURSE TRANSFER CREDITS

Unless the student timely elects to take a distance education course for a descriptive grade (when a numerical or letter grade is expected to be awarded by the professor), the course itself does not affect the student's ability to elect to take two eligible, non-distance education, elective courses for a descriptive grade.

### VIII. ADDING/DROPPING SUMMER COURSES

No student will be allowed to add a class after that class has held its first two class sessions. A student may add a class after that class has held its initial session only if the student obtains the professor's written consent *prior to* the second session.

Students who decide to drop a class *may* receive a pro-rata refund of tuition depending on the drop date (as calculated by university personnel and as permitted by university policy). Students who drop a summer class after the University imposed last drop date are <u>responsible for all tuition and fees</u>, subject to the exclusion section below.

#### IX. CANCELING A COURSE

Through May 22<sup>nd</sup>, the law school may cancel any course which at that time has an enrollment of fewer than seven (7) students. Affected students and professors will be promptly notified. A distance education course that draws fewer than eighteen (18) students (collectively, not just from Campbell) may be canceled by BarBri Legal Ed (*Keep this possibility in mind before you purchase books, seek financial aid, etc.*)

#### X. ACADEMIC COURSE OF STUDY AND EXCLUSION

Final transcripts for the spring semester may not be available until after summer school begins. Students who are excluded from further academic study will be administratively withdrawn from summer school. A student who is excluded from further academic study but who is eligible to petition for a waiver of the exclusion rule may attend summer school classes until the Academic Appeals Committee acts on the petition. If the petition

for readmission is denied, the student will be administratively withdrawn from summer school and will not receive a tuition refund. Students in this situation are strongly encouraged not to enroll in summer school.

#### XI. FINANCIAL AID

Summer school study qualifies for financial aid. As always, you must be at least a half-time student to qualify. Half-time status for summer school is a minimum of 2.5 credit hours (externship credits do not count toward this requirement unless the student opts to pay tuition charges for the credits -- see "**Special Note on Externships**" below). Once summer school registration is complete, students must timely email Lisa Clark at clarkl@campbell.edu to request summer school financial aid. Students who are administratively withdrawn from summer school should refer all financial questions to Lisa Clark.

#### XII. SPECIAL NOTE ON EXTERNSHIPS

Pursuant to Campbell Law's Academic Standards and Regulations, a student must have successfully completed twenty-seven (27) credit hours to be eligible to participate in the externship program. Eligible students have two options when registering for a summer externship:

- 1. Option One: A student may register for summer externship credits, pay no tuition charges for those credits, and Registrar Newsome will post those externship credits to the student's Fall 2023 semester transcript with notation indicating that the credits were earned in the summer. These deferred credits will NOT count against the student in calculating the 17-credit hour cap for the Fall 2023 semester. If this is your preferred option, please register for LAW 891S LR01 or LAW 892S LR01.
- 2. Option Two: A student may register for summer externship credits, pay the applicable tuition charges for those credits (for reasons pertaining to financial aid benefits or otherwise), and Registrar Newsome will post those externship credits to the student's Summer 2023 semester transcript. No single externship may be for more than two credits. If this is your preferred option, please register for LAW 891S LR02 or LAW 892S LR02. Please know that a student must register for at least 2.5 credit hours to qualify for financial aid.

A student who (for any reason, including, without limitation, transferring to another law school or withdrawing from Campbell) does not register for at least ten law school credits for Fall 2023 MUST select "Option Two." Otherwise, the student will not receive academic credit for summer externships.

FLEX Students & Externships: FLEX students who are eligible to participate in the Summer Externship Program must pay summer tuition or include the summer externship hours within the maximum 9 credit hour cap of registered credit hours for the fall semester.

#### XIII. SUMMER COURSES GRADE IMPACT ON GPA, PROBATION & ACADEMIC EXCLUSION:

Pursuant to the Campbell Law Academic Standards and Regulations, summer school course offerings do not constitute a separate "semester." Therefore, academic probation based on "semester GPA" standards shall not apply to grades earned in summer session courses. Grades earned in summer session courses shall not be calculated into any prior or prospective semester to raise or lower a student's "semester GPA." Summer session course grades do affect cumulative academic progress and are calculated into a student's cumulative grade point average for the purposes of the Campbell Law academic standards. Consequently, grades earned

in summer school session courses apply to probation and exclusion standards related to <u>cumulative</u> academic progress including, but not limited to, required cumulative grade point averages after the completion of prior semesters and the total number of grades that may be earned below 65. Unless otherwise excluded by the rules for Academic Exclusion, a student whose cumulative grade point average after the summer session is below 75 shall be placed on academic probation for the next semester. Similarly, a student may be excluded after the summer session pursuant to the rules on academic exclusion that are based on cumulative academic grade progress.

## XIV. BOOKS/MATERIALS

Information on books/materials required (or suggested / recommended) for summer courses is available by contacting the course professor. Once the law school determines which courses will have sufficient enrollment to remain scheduled, professors will place book orders through the University bookstore system (probably in early April).
