The scholarship will be awarded to a law student in good academic standing at an institution with a duly registered NBLSA chapter or who has an individual NBLSA membership.

A \$7,500 scholarship will be paid to the law school of the recipient for education expenses, and the recipient will also receive an invitation to the ODBAR BBQ in Philadelphia on July 15, 2023.

Applicants must submit an essay of no more than five pages, double-spaced, on the following topic:

In 2013, the Supreme Court of the United States considered and affirmed the use of race-conscious processes in undergraduate admissions in Fisher v. University of Texas at Austin. This year, the Supreme Court is slated to issue decisions in two additional cases involving affirmative action in higher education: Students for Fair Admissions, Inc. v. President and Fellows of Harvard College and Students for Fair Admissions, Inc. v. University of North Carolina. Applying the precedent articulated in Fisher, what do you think the Supreme Court's decision will be in these two cases?
