


Succeeding in Law School & Beyond

For 17 years, Parker Poe has hosted a daylong program to help minority students navigate law school, make a successful transition into the practice of law after graduation, and thrive as they pursue the different paths a legal career may take. More than 800 students have attended since the program's inception.

RALEIGH KEYNOTE SPEAKER: JUSTICE ANITA EARLS

In January 1988, Justice Earls joined the firm of Ferguson, Stein, Watt, Wallas, Adkins & Gresham in Charlotte, North Carolina. Justice Earls was appointed by President Clinton in 1998 to serve as Deputy Assistant Attorney General in the Civil Rights Division of the U.S. Department of Justice. From 2000 to 2003, she directed the Voting Rights Project at the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law. Returning to North Carolina in 2003, she joined Julius Chambers at the UNC Center for Civil Rights as Director of Advocacy. In 2007 Justice Earls founded the Southern Coalition for Social Justice, a non-profit legal advocacy organization and served as its Executive Director for ten years. She is admitted to practice in North Carolina, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. Supreme Court.
